A ster is a lab mix who has been at the shelter for over a year. You may remember Aster and her two sisters, Autumn and Amber, who came into our shelter in 2023 when they were just three months

old. Shortly after their arrival, they became critically ill, and we found out they had ingested rat poison before they came to us.

Thanks in part to our generous supporters, we were able to save them and pay off their huge vet bill. Autumn and Amber have found their forever homes, but poor Aster is still with us. She is good with kids and other dogs, is spayed, microchipped, and up to date on all shots. She is described as playful, goofy and high energy, but who wouldn't be after spending almost your entire life in a shelter!

Piper is a 5-year-old boxer mix who came to us when her owner passed away. As you can imagine, being at the shelter is very confusing and stressful for her since she had been in a home since she was a puppy. Piper lived in a home with a cat, and we recommend a slow introduction.

Piper would be great for someone looking for a couch companion. She is housetrained, up-to-date

on her vaccines and heartworm negative - the only thing missing is you!




Bernie was well known and loved not only by his fellow PCHS volunteers but also by many people in the Hampstead area where he lived.
